- quilt weight cotton top, thin to medium batting, quilt weight cotton backing, basted together
- an embroidery or quilting hoop, slightly smaller than your project
- quilting thread
- needles (betweens--size 8 or 9 for beginners)
- thimble that fits the middle finger of your dominant hand
- small scissors.

Our next quilt show will be held on September 29th. Here are some ways to get involved:

- Make quilts!!! We hang all members' quilts and like to have something from everyone if possible. All quilts need a sleeve at least 3" wide attached to the back by sewing or pinning.
- Sell tickets for our opportunity quilt. This can be a big money-maker for us, but we need all members to sell!
- Work on a committee for the show. Check with Rebecca Peters or Barb Robinson to see where help is still needed.
- Volunteer to help the day of the quilt show. Help is needed with setting up for and assisting vendors, acting as white glove hostesses, registering quilts during set up and takedown, staffing the admissions table, setting up and staffing the trading post. Look out for sign-up sheets in the upcoming months!

Service Projects and How Members Can Participate

YWCA Domestic Abuse Shelter

- Members can: donate tops we can finish, donated finished quilts, donate batting or fabric, come help on workdays to layer, turn, tie or machine quilt, bind, and label the quilts.

NICU quilts

- We make 30"-36" square quilts for babies in the NICU at both area hospitals. These quilts can be any pattern and must be backed with flannel. We also make hats for preemies in soft yarn.
- Members can: donate finished quilts or tops, donate flannel, come help to make the quilts.
- Size: 30" square to 36" square. Flannel backing. No invisible thread for machine quilting.
- Workdays: 1st and 3rd Mondays, Immanuel United Church of Christ, 1526 South 18th Street, Lafayette, 9:30-2:30

- Members can: Make a bag out of any non double-knit fabric. Should be 18-20" by 24-28". Fill it with scraps until it is about three quarters full then sew it shut. Bring it to any meeting and it will be donated or take it to a shelter or vet's office and report the number to the quild.
