Our next quilt show will be held on September 29th. Important information to know:

Entering Quilts

Attached to this newsletter is the form that needs to be completed to enter quilts in this year's show. There is no fee. There is no limit to the number of quilts you can enter, but please rank your quilts in case we are not able to show all entries due to space. Our goal is to have at least 1-2 from every member. Quilts finished since the 2016 show are eligible. All quilts need a sleeve at least 3" wide attached to the back by sewing or pinning. This show is not judged so don't worry about how good or bad you think your quilt is. All quilts are encouraged. The more and varied quilts we have, the more attendees love the show!

Paper copies will be available at the August and September meetings. Here's a hint: Print out one copy of the form, fill in your name, email address, and phone number, then make as many copies as you need for your quilts. Fill in the info on each individual quilt and you are ready. Information on the form will be used for the quilt labels. Forms are due by **September 4th**.

2018 Quilt Show Challenge

FOOD, GLORIOUS FOOD!

Your challenge is to create a meal on a quilt! You can use appliqué, piecing or embroidery, and you can embellish to your heart's content. Your meal could be breakfast, lunch, dinner or even afternoon tea. It could even be a meal for your pet!

MAXIMUM size to be 30" long, 18" high.

Other Ways to Help

- Sell tickets for our opportunity quilt and bring tickets/money to August and September meetings.
- Volunteer to help the day of the quilt show. There are electronic and paper forms where you can sign up for a specific job (such as setting up for and assisting vendors, acting as white glove hostesses, registering quilts during set up and takedown, staffing the admissions table, setting up and staffing the trading post.)
- Promote the show. Hand out flyers and bookmarks. Tell all your friends in person and on Facebook!
- Know of a group that could volunteer to help set up and/or take down the show? We could use a lot of help in this area. Let Barb or Rebecca know if your group is interested.
- Collect and price items for the trading post and bring to Faith East on Friday the 28th. Everything besides books, magazines, and patterns should be priced ahead of time. Set up will start at 3:00. Items can be purchased on Friday, but exact change is required. Items should be priced to sell, but \$.25 is the minimum price. White plastic bags are also requested to put purchases in.

Quilt Camp 2018

Our annual Quilt Camp will be held November 1st-4th at the Pine View Resort in Monticello. The theme will be *A Night at The Movies*. There is space for 40 campers. The registration form will be available at the next two months' meetings. You can pay in full when you register or pay a \$25 deposit and pay the balance by October 15th. Refunds will only be available after October 15th if we are able to fill your spot. The cost is as follows:

- 2 people in a room: \$180 per person.
- 3 People in a room: \$140 per person.
- 4 people in a room: \$120 per person.

This covers all meals (breakfast each day from the hotel, lunch and dinner Friday and Saturday, and brunch on Sunday). NO meals will be served Thursday, so you will be on your own. You can check in Thursday after 11 am and check out by noon on Sunday. There is no discount for less than 3 nights.

More details about activities and supply lists will be available in October. This is a motel, with beds and bathrooms, so no need to bring bedding, towels etc. You will need all your sewing supplies! Most important to know: the lighting in our sewing room is not great, so you will need to bring lights for your workspace. Direct all questions to Andrea, Brenda or Annabel.

Quilt Camp Committees

Committees are needed to make Quilt Camp a success! Here are the committees and their jobs. Contact Andrea if you can help!

Registration - Takes care of registering campers and assigning rooms, all other hotel contacts.

Rummage sale/quilt shop - Coordinates a rummage sale table, arranges for a quilt shop to set up if desired.

Programs-Make It, Take It; Mystery Quilt; whatever else the committee wants to plan.

Set Up/Clean Up-The the hotel will set up the tables, we need to set up the rest of the room (irons, cutting table, table assignments, etc.) and be sure all is clean, and all our stuff is gone at the end.

Hospitality-Table decorations, Menu cards, name tags, etc.
